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Things to keep in mind

- 1. Emails should use the following subject format: "Task number: your name." For example, if your name is John Doe and you are submitting Task 5, your email subject should be "Task 5: John Doe." Emails with incorrect subject formats will not be considered.
- 2. Don't plagiarize
- 3. Don't be afraid to ask questions
- 4. Please submit all tasks on time
- 5. Accepted formats are Google Docs, Word or PDF.

Day 1

Task 1: Observational Reporting

Objective: Each journalist will be assigned a specific committee and must report on its proceedings from a unique perspective.

Word Limit: 250-350 words.

Style: Formal, with a clear headline and quotes if available. Use a newspaper-style format.

Task 2: Creative Freedom

Objective: Pick any topic related to a committee or the conference and create a piece with complete creative freedom.

Requirements:

Format: Any format—article, poem, story, op-ed, etc.

Length: Flexible; keep it concise and engaging.

Day 2

Task 3: Op-Ed (Personal Opinion)

Objective: You will be assigned a committee and write an op-ed about its agenda.

Requirements:

Word Limit: 250-350 words.

Content: Share your personal opinions and analysis of the

committee's topics. Use facts to support your viewpoint and provide

clear arguments.

Style: Formal.

Task 4: One Moment

Objective: Write a brief, creative description of a memorable moment from the committee sessions.

Requirements:

Word Limit: 100-150 words.

Content: Use imaginative language to capture a key moment,

highlighting its impact and atmosphere.

Format: Short and creative
